- 1. GRANTEE: MEMC Pasadena, Incorporated Pasadena, Texas
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION: a. This exemption authorizes the shipment of Silicon tetrafluoride... b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption...
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 173.301 (f) (2), § 173.302a(a) (3) except as specified herein.
5. BASIS: This exemption is based on MEMC Pasadena, Incorporated's application dated April 30, 2003...
6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

Table with 4 columns: Proper Shipping Name, Hazard Class/Division, Identification Number, Packing Group. Row 1: Silicon tetrafluoride, compressed; 2.3; UN1859; NA

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

PACKAGING - Packaging prescribed is a DOT Specification 3AAX cylinder built of 4130X alloy steel and having a service pressure of at least 2200 psi. The cylinders may be manifolded in accordance with the provisions described in the February 25, 1985 application filed by Ethyl Corporation.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

a. A person who is not a holder of this exemption who receives a package covered by this exemption may reoffer it for transportation provided no modifications or changes are made to the package and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this exemption and the HMR.

b. A current copy of this exemption must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.

c. MARKING - Each cylinder must be marked "DOT-E 9408".

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.

10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport cylinders covered by this exemption.

11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law 49 U.S.C. Section 5101 et seq.:


- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
- o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
