1. GRANTEE: Affival, Incorporated  
Amherst, NY
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
  - a. This exemption authorizes the transportation in commerce of metal tubing which contains hazardous materials listed in paragraph 6 of this exemption and exempts the metal tubing from the packaging, marking, labeling, and placarding requirements of the Hazardous Materials Regulations. This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.
  - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.
  - c. Party status will not be granted to this exemption.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR Part 172 Subparts D, E, and F in that the metal tubing is exempt from marking, labeling, and placarding; § 173.24(c), and Subparts E and F of Part 173 in that the packaging is not authorized, except as specified herein.
5. BASIS: This exemption is based on the application of Affival, Incorporated dated September 24, 2003, submitted in accordance with § 107.109.

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

PACKAGING - The hazardous material must be in the core of a metal tube and the seam of the tube must be sealed with a vapor tight double overlapped locked seam (identified in drawing 11B1, submitted by the applicant on August 5, 1994 on file the Office of Hazardous Materials Exemptions and Approvals).

- a. The tube is limited to a maximum diameter of 25 mm (1 inch) and cannot exceed 1 kg (2.2 pounds) of hazardous material per meter.
- b. The tube is limited to 10,000 meters per reel or cage.
- c. The ends of the tube must be sealed with a suitable vapor tight cap.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

a. A person who is not a holder of this exemption who receives a package covered by this exemption may reoffer it for transportation provided no modification or change is made to the package or its contents and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this exemption and the HMR.

b. A current copy of this exemption must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.

c. MARKING - The reel or cage must be marked with "DOT-E 11180" in letters at least 2 inches high on a contrasting background.

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle, rail freight and cargo vessel.10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each cargo vessel and motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this exemption.11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:


- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
- o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving fire, explosion or loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
