1. GRANTEE: VIACOM Inc.
Pittsburgh, PA
(Former Grantee: CBS Corporation)

2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:

a. This exemption authorizes the transportation in commerce of restricted quantities of hazardous materials that are authorized for exception in column A of 49 CFR Table 172.101, excluding Class 1, Class 7 and Divisions 6.1 and 6.2. Shipments of these materials are exempt from shipping paper and marking requirements when transported in private carriage and in accordance with the conditions specified in this exemption. This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.

b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.

3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR Part 172, Subparts C and D except § 172.312, and except as prescribed herein.

5. BASIS: This exemption is based on the application of VIACOM Inc. dated January 16, 2002 submitted in accordance with § 107.109.
6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

* No Packaging Group I materials are authorized.

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. PACKAGING - Prescribed packagings are combination packagings made of rigid plastic or metal with a secure closure mechanism meeting the following limitations:

- i. Inner packagings for liquid hazardous material are limited to 1 liter net capacity.
- ii. Inner packagings for solids hazardous material are limited to 1 kilogram net capacity.
- iii. No more than 2 liters or 2 kilograms total of any one hazardous material may be transported in one vehicle, regardless of how the material is subdivided.
- iv. Each package must conform to the packaging requirements of §§ 173.24 and 173.24a.

b. MARKING - Each package must be marked as follows:

- i. With the company name, address, a 24-hour emergency response phone number and the statement "Contains Chemicals - DOT-E 11197" in letters at least one inch high on a contrasting background.

- ii. As required by § 172.312.
- c. OTHER CONTROL MEASURES - The maximum gross weight of the packages authorized by this exemption must not exceed 60 kg (132 pounds) per vehicle.
- 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS - Packages may only be transported in vehicles operated by employees or persons subject to this exemption.
- 9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle (private carrier).
- 10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this exemption must be carried in each motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this exemption.
- 11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101, et seq.:
 - o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
 - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8 who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

- 12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The shipper is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this

exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.


