2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
  - a. This exemption authorizes the transportation in commerce of Division 4.2 (self-heating) materials in packing group II or III on the same transport vehicle with Class 8 (corrosive) liquids when the materials are separated in accordance with paragraph 7. This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.
  - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 177.848(d) in that Division 4.2 materials may not be loaded, transported, or stored together in the same transport vehicle with Class 8 liquids except as specified herein.

5. BASIS: This exemption is based on the application of Los Angeles Chemical Co., dated March 19, 2004, submitted in accordance with § 107.109.

6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

- a. PACKAGING - The sodium hydrosulfite must be packaged in 1A2 steel drums that meet the packing group II performance requirements of Subpart M of Part 178. The self-heating, solid, organic, n.o.s. material must be packaged in 1G fiber drums meeting packing group II performance requirements of Subpart M of Part 178.
- b. SEGREGATION - To prevent commingling on the transport vehicle, the hazardous materials must be palletized with a minimum height of four (4) inches off the floor and the Division 4.2 material must be separated from the corrosive liquids by a minimum of four (4) feet.

8. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.

9. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this exemption.

10. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq.:

- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.


- o Persons operating under the terms of this exemption must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
- o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

11. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
