2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:

a. This exemption authorizes the transportation in commerce of shrink wrapped pallets containing boxes of waste ORM-D materials with the word "WASTE" marked on the outside of the pallet instead of on each individual box. This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.

b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.

3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 172.301(a)(2) in that relief from the marking requirements is not authorized, except as specified herein.
5. BASIS: This exemption is based on the application of Heritage Transport, LLC dated August 1, 2003, submitted in accordance with § 107.109 and additional information dated May 25, 2004.

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:a. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS.

(1) Packages of expired consumer commodities must be in their original undamaged packaging and marked with the "Consumer Commodity ORM-D" marking.

(2) Packages must be securely affixed to a pallet and shrink wrapped.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS: The outside of the shrink wrap must be marked on opposite sides with:

DOT-E 11470
Waste
Consumer Commodity ORM-D

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: This exemption imposes no additional modal requirements.11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:

- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
- o Persons operating under the terms of this exemption must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.


- o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
