1. **GRANTEE:** Safety-Kleen Systems, Inc.
Plano, TX
(Former grantee: Safety-Kleen Corporation)

2. **PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:**

a. This exemption authorizes the transportation in commerce of various household wastes without having the quantity and unit measurement shown on the shipping paper during local pick-up operations. This exemption provides no relief from any Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.

b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.

3. **REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED:** 49 CFR parts 107 and 171-180.
4. **REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED:** 49 CFR § 172.202(c), except as specified herein.
5. **BASIS:** This exemption is based on the application of Safety-Kleen Systems, Inc. dated March 11, 2004, submitted in accordance with § 107.109.

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
6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 § CFR 172.101): Hazardous materials that are "household wastes" as described in 40 CFR 261.4(b).
7. PACKAGING AND SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES: Materials authorized under this exemption are limited to "household wastes" that are not subject to the Environmental Protection Agency's hazardous waste regulations in 40 CFR, Parts 262 and 263.
8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:
 - a. During local collection operations, the display of quantity or unit measurement is not required on shipping papers.
 - b. A person who is not a holder of this exemption who receives a package covered by this exemption may reoffer it for transportation provided no modifications or changes are made to the package and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this exemption and the HMR.
 - c. A current copy of this exemption must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.
9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.
10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this exemption.
11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:
 - o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
 - o Persons operating under the terms of this exemption must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
 - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. **REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:** The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incident involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
