1. GRANTEE: Williams Field Services  
Opal, WY
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
  - a. This exemption authorizes attendants of a cargo tank loading facility to remain in a warming shack during loading operations which is not within the required 25 feet from the cargo tank. This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.
  - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 177.834(i)(3) in that the loading or unloading of a cargo tank without the attendance of a qualified person within 25 feet of the cargo tank is not authorized, except as specified herein.
5. BASIS: This exemption is based on the application of Williams Field Services dated September 16, 2004, submitted in accordance with § 107.109.

6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):**SEP 21 2004**

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. PACKAGING - Prescribed Packagings are DOT Specification cargo tanks authorized to transport gasoline and liquefied petroleum gas.

b. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS -

(1) There must be an emergency shutdown switch for the loading rack by the front door of the warming shack.

(2) The warming shack must have windows in order for the drivers to see the loading rack and the truck with an unobstructed view.

(3) The loading operations must be monitored via television camera from a control center 1/4 mile from the loading rack. The control room is manned 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and contains an emergency shutdown for the rack.

(4) Each attendant at the automated truck loading facility must be trained in emergency procedures that must be followed in the event that both emergency shutdown switches in the warming shack and in the control room fail.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS: None as a requirement of this exemption.

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.

10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: None as a requirement of this exemption.

11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:
- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
  - o Persons operating under the terms of this exemption must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
  - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
