1. GRANTEE: Wampum Hardware Co.

2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:

a. This exemption authorizes the transportation in commerce of certain Class 1 (explosive) materials of different compatibility groups in the same motor vehicle in the vehicle spaces of a vessel under conditions as described herein. This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.

b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.

3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.

4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 176.168(e) in that Class 1 materials of different compatibility groups may not be stowed in the same vehicle, except as specified herein.

5. BASIS: This exemption is based on the application of Wampum Hardware Company dated July 29, 2004, submitted in accordance with § 107.109.

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES: Packagings must be in compliance with § 173.62. Stowage of all Class 1 materials in the motor vehicle must meet the requirements of § 177.835(g).
8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS: None as a requirement of this exemption.
9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Ferry vessel.
10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS:
- A current copy of this exemption and the shipper's certification must be carried on the motor vehicle used to transport the hazardous materials covered by this exemption.
 - Only the applicant's employees and their respective vehicles and the ferry vessel's crew are permitted onboard the ferry during transit. No other vehicles or passengers are authorized.
 - Two fire hoses must be charged and readily available during the time the applicant's vehicles are loaded, ferried and unloaded.
 - This exemption applies only to ferry transits between Marblehead, OH and Kelly's Island, OH.

11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:


- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
- o Persons operating under the terms of this exemption must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
- o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when this exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incident involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
