1. GRANTEE: EMD Chemicals Inc.
Cincinnati, OH
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
 - a. This exemption authorizes the transportation in commerce of certain hazardous materials listed in paragraph 6 below across a public road, from one part of a plant to another. This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.
 - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR §§ 171.1(a)(1), 172.200(a) in that shipping papers are not required; 172.301(c) and 172.302(c) in that the exemption number marking requirement is waived, except as specified herein.
5. BASIS: This exemption is based on the application of EM Chemicals, Inc., dated February 10, 2003, submitted in accordance with § 107.109.

6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES: Prescribed packagings must be in accordance with the requirements of the Hazardous Materials Regulations, as appropriate.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

- a. Materials covered under this exemption must be transported by vehicles owned and operated by EMD Chemicals Inc.
- b. The maximum quantity of materials transported per shipment (trip) is twenty-four (24) skids (pallets).

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.

10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: No additional requirements other than as required by the HMR.

11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:


- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
- o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incident involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
