1. GRANTEE: General Electric Energy Rental's, Inc.
Atlanta, GA
(Former grantee: General Electric International)
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
 - a. This exemption authorizes the transportation in commerce of reconditioned ("used") refrigeration units under the provisions of § 173.306(e). This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.
 - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 173.306(e)(1) in that used refrigeration units are not considered "new (unused) refrigerating machines or components" and therefore not authorized for the exception except as specified herein.
5. BASIS: This exemption is based on the application of General Electric Energy Rentals, Incorporated dated January 15, 2004, submitted in accordance with § 107.109 and additional information dated January 16, 2004.

6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. PACKAGING - Packaging prescribed is a used refrigerating machine. The used refrigerating machine must conform to the requirements of § 173.306(e) and be permanently affixed to a steel base structure suitable for placement on a double drop trailer. The Class A refrigerant weight per machine ranges from 50 lb. to a maximum of 2500 lb.

b. TESTING - In addition to the requirements contained in § 173.306(e), each used refrigerating machine must be tested as required by the General Electric Company's Maintenance Procedures on file with the Office of Hazardous Materials Exemptions and Approvals (OHMEA). A copy of the completed test report must accompany each machine.

c. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS - Prior to each return of a refrigerating machine to the General Electric Energy Rental District Office the refrigeration machine must have satisfactorily passed the General Electric Company's Maintenance Procedures for the specific refrigerating machine. These procedures are on file with OHMEA. A copy of the completed inspection report must accompany each machine.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

a. A person who is not a holder of this exemption who receives a package covered by this exemption may reoffer it for transportation provided no modifications or change are made to the package and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this exemption and the HMR.

b. A current copy of this exemption must be maintained at each facility where the refrigeration machine is offered or reoffered for transportation.

c. MARKING - The outside of each refrigeration machine must be plainly and durably marked in two inch letters "DOT-E 12373" as prescribed in 49 CFR § 172.302(c).

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.
10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport refrigeration machines covered by this exemption.
11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:
- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
 - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when this exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken

under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incident involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
